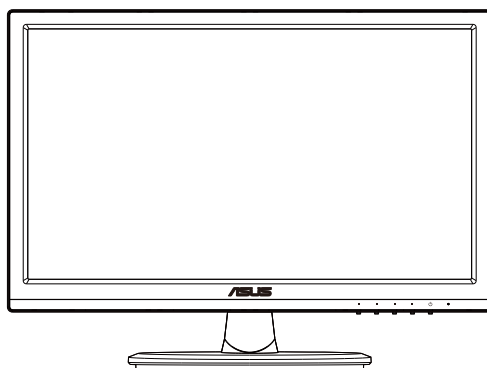

## Safety information

- To prevent fire or shock hazard, never expose the monitor to rain or moisture.
- Never try to open the monitor cabinet. The dangerous high voltages inside the monitor may result in serious physical injury.
- If the power supply is broken, do not try to fix it by yourself. Contact a qualified service technician or your retailer.
- Before using the product, make sure all cables are correctly connected and the power cables are not damaged. If you detect any damage, contact your dealer immediately.
- Slots and openings on the back or top of the cabinet are provided for ventilation. Do not block these slots. Never place this product near or over a radiator or heat source unless proper ventilation is provided.
- The monitor should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your dealer or local power company.

## Care & Cleaning

- Before you lift or reposition your monitor, it is better to disconnect the cables and power cord. Follow the correct lifting techniques when positioning the monitor. When lifting or carrying the monitor, grasp the edges of the monitor. Do not lift the display by the stand or the cord.
- Cleaning. Turn your monitor off and unplug the power cord. Clean the monitor surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Stubborn stains may be removed with a cloth dampened with mild cleaner.
- Avoid using a cleaner containing alcohol or acetone. Use a cleaner intended for use with the LCD. Never spray cleaner directly on the screen, as it may drip inside the monitor and cause an electric shock.

### The following symptoms are normal with the monitor:

- The screen may flicker during the initial use due to the nature of the fluorescent light. Turn off the Power Switch and turn it on again to make sure that the flicker disappears.
- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
- When the same image is displayed for hours, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image. The screen will recover slowly or you can turn off the Power Switch for hours.
- When the screen becomes black or flashes, or cannot work anymore, contact your dealer or service center to fix it. Do not repair the screen by yourself!

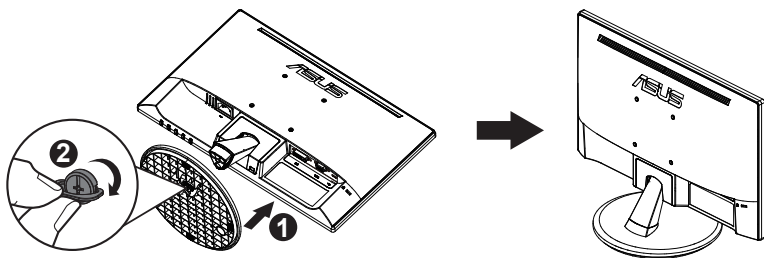
## 1.3 Assembling the monitor base

2. Adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.



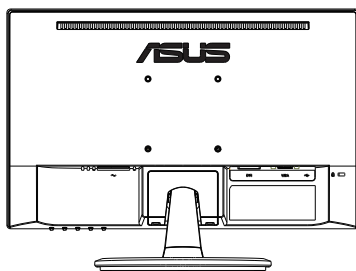
We recommend that you cover the table surface with soft cloth to prevent damage to the monitor.

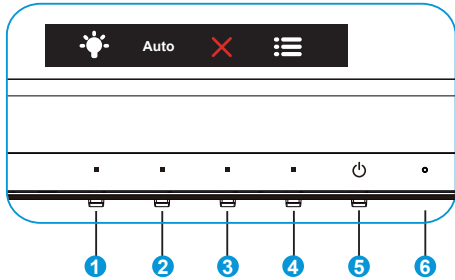

# 1.5 Monitor introduction

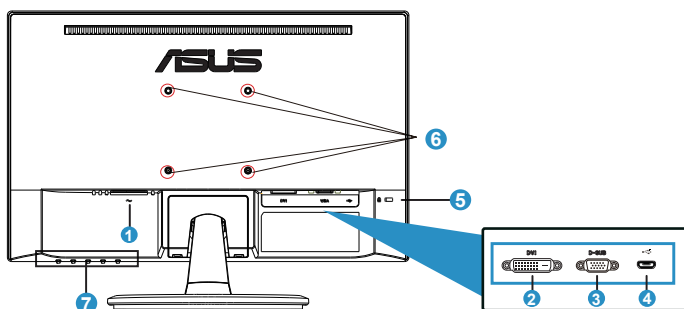
## 1.5.1 Front of the LCD monitor



1. Shortcut key:
  - This is a Shortcut key. The default setting is Blue Light Filter.
2. Auto Button:
  - Auto Adjust.: Automatically adjust the image to its optimized position, clock, and phase.
3. Close Button:
  - Exit the OSD menu.
4. MENU Button:
  - Press this button to enter the OSD menu.
5. Power Button:
  - Press this button to turn the monitor on/off.
6. Power Indicator:
  - The color definition of the power indicator is as the table below.

1. AC-IN port
2. DVI port

## 2.1 Detaching the base/stand (for VESA wall mount)

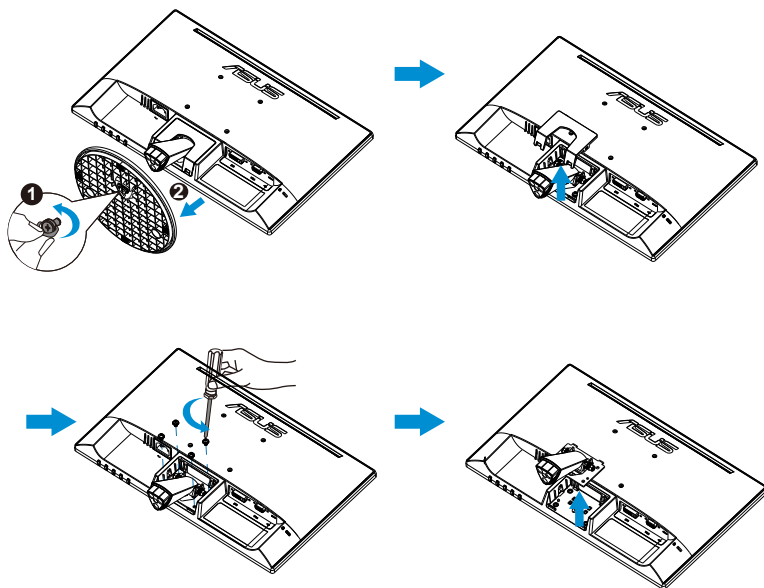
The detachable stand of the LCD monitor is specially designed for VESA wall mount.

### To detach the arm/stand:

1. Disconnect power and signal cables. Carefully put the front of the monitor face down on a clean table.
2. Use your finger to loosen the screw located at the bottom of the base, and remove the base from the stand. And then remove the hinge cover from monitor body by using your fingers.
3. Use a screwdriver to remove the four screws on the arm, and then detach the arm/stand from the monitor.



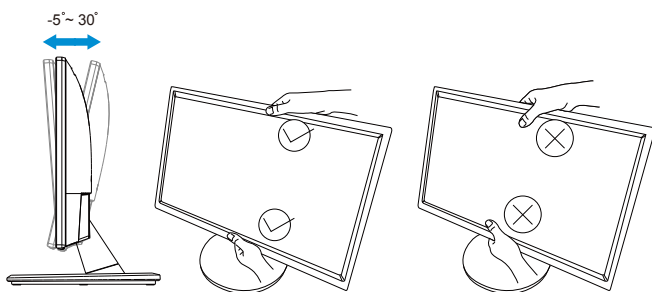
- We recommend that you cover the table surface with soft cloth to prevent damage to the monitor.
- Hold the stand of the monitor while removing the screws.



- The VESA wall mount kit ( 75 x 75 mm) is purchased separately.
- Use only the UL Listed Wall Mount Bracket with minimum weight/load 4.8kg according to the model listed in the specification table (Screw size: M4 x 10 mm).

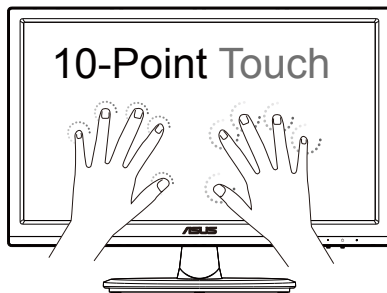
## 2.2 Adjusting the monitor

- For optimal viewing, we recommend that you look at the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.
- Hold the stand to prevent the monitor from falling while changing its angle.
- You can adjust the monitor's angle from  $-5^{\circ}$  to  $30^{\circ}$ .
- Do not touch the Touch screen when you change the angle. It may cause damage or break the Touch screen and LCD screen.



## 3.1 Touch Operation

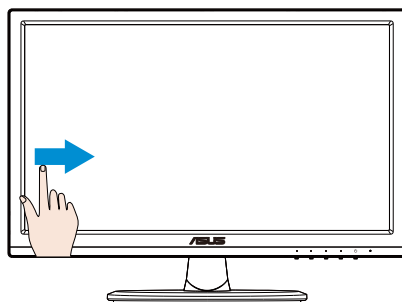
- ASUS VT168 is a touch monitor which uses 10 point touch panel technology. Please use with latest OS like Windows 10.
- You can use either single finger touch, or multi-finger touch up to maximum simultaneous 10 touch points.



- To activate touch functionality, you need to connect the display with the provided Micro-USB cable to your computer.
- You do not need to install any other software.
- ASUS VT168 offers you groovy touch gestures like tap, grab, pinch, rotate, zoom, swipe, etc. The gestures allow you to launch programs and access the setting of your ASUS VT168 Display. The functions can be activated by using the hand gestures to ASUS VT168.

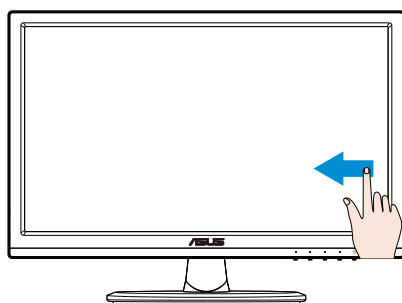
### **Left edge swipe (on Windows 7/8/8.1/10 only)**

Swipe from the left edge of the screen to shuffle your running apps.



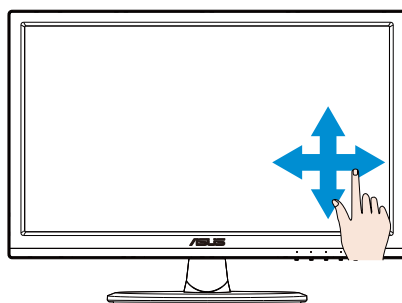
### **Right edge swipe (on Windows 7/8/8.1/10 only)**

Swipe from the right edge of the screen to launch the Charm bar.



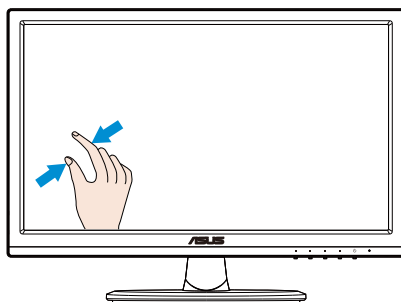
### **Finger slide (on Windows 7/8/8.1/10 only)**

Slide your finger to scroll up and down and slide your finger to pan the screen left or right.



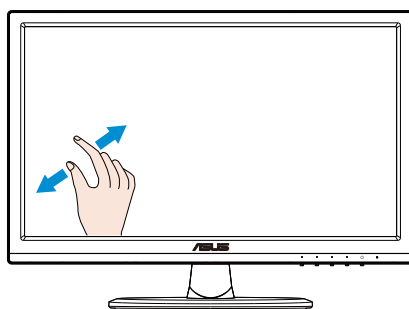
## Zoom out

## Zoom in

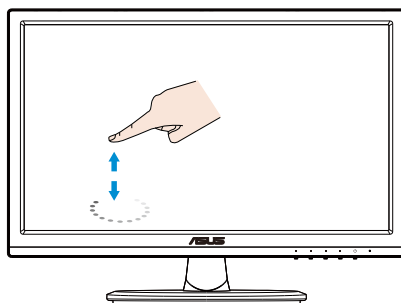
Spread apart your two fingers on the touch panel.



## Single Tap/Double tap

### Single Tap

Touch the target on the screen with one fingertip for one quick tap, then release.

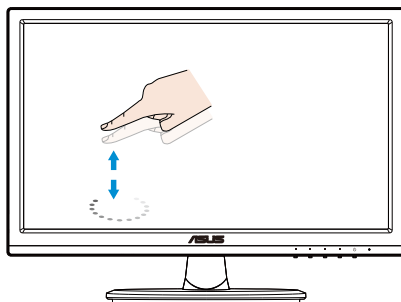


## Double Tap

Touch the target on the screen with one fingertip for two quick taps, then release.

Tap an app to launch it (on Windows 7/8/8.1/10 only).

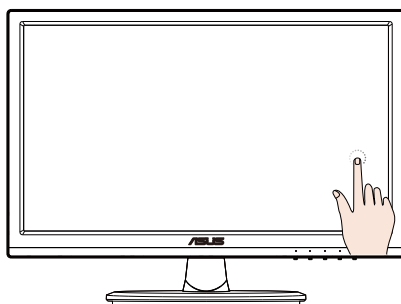
Double-tap an item to launch it.



## Tap and hold

To move an app, tap and hold the app tile and drag it to a new location.

To close an app (on Windows 7/8/8.1/10 only), tap and hold the top side of the running app and drag it down to the bottom of the screen to close it.





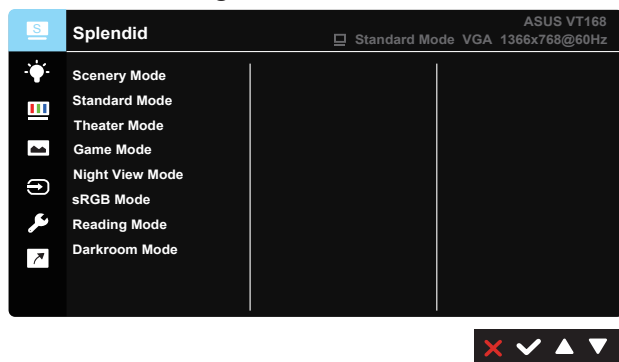


**NOTE:**• You can access to OS website to get more description on touch operation.

- Do not touch the screen with sharp objects, it may result in damage, and void warranty.
- Do not push hard, or rest anything on the glass surface (if in horizontal position) as it will damage the screen and void warranty.
- Please keep your hands clean and dry before touching the screen to ensure fluid touch operation.
- The touch function works only on OS and applications which support touch functions.

## 4.1 OSD (On-Screen Display) menu

### 4.1.1 How to reconfigure

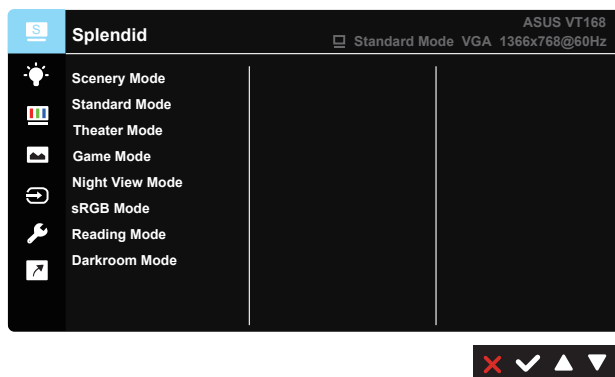


1. Press the [MENU] button to activate the OSD menu.
2. Press ▼ and ▲ buttons to toggle between options in the Menu. As you move from one icon to another, the option name is highlighted.
3. To select the highlighted item on the menu press the ✓ button.
4. Press ▼ and ▲ buttons to select the desired parameter.
5. Press the ✓ button to enter the slide bar and then use the ▼ or ▲ buttons, according to the indicators on the menu, to make your changes.
6. Press the ↶ button to return to previous menu or ✕ to close OSD menu.

### 4.1.2 OSD Function Introduction

#### 1. Splendid

This function contains eight sub-functions that you can select for your preference. Each mode has the Reset selection, allowing you to maintain your setting or return to the preset mode.



- **Scenery Mode:** This is the best choice for scenery photo displaying with SPLENDID™ Video Enhancement.
- **Standard Mode:** This is the best choice for document editing with SPLENDID™ Video Enhancement.
- **Theater Mode:** This is the best choice for movie watching with SPLENDID™ Video Enhancement.
- **Game Mode:** This is the best choice for game playing with SPLENDID™ Video Enhancement.
- **Night View Mode:** This is the best choice for playing dark-scene game or watching movie with SPLENDID™ Video Enhancement.
- **sRGB:** This is the best choice for viewing photos and graphics from PCs.
- **Reading Mode :** This is the best choice for book reading.
- **Darkroom Mode :** This is the best choice for a weak ambient light environmen.

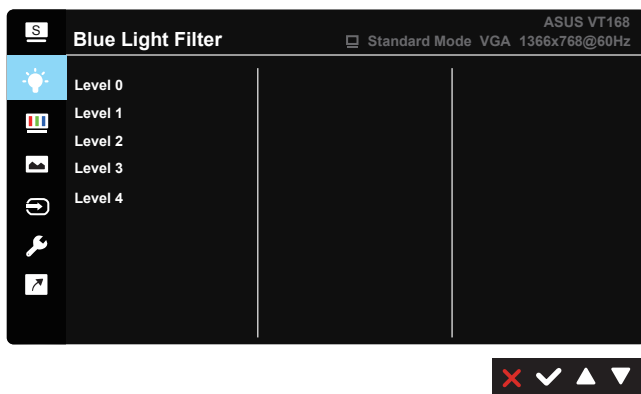


In the **Standard Mode**, the **Saturation**, **Skin Tone**, **Sharpness**, and **ASCR** functions are not user-configurable.

In the **sRGB**, the **Brightness**, **Contrast**, **Saturation**, **Color Temp.**, **Skin Tone**, **Sharpness**, and **ASCR** functions are not user-configurable.

## 2. Blue Light Filter

Adjust the energy level of blue light emitted from LED backlight.



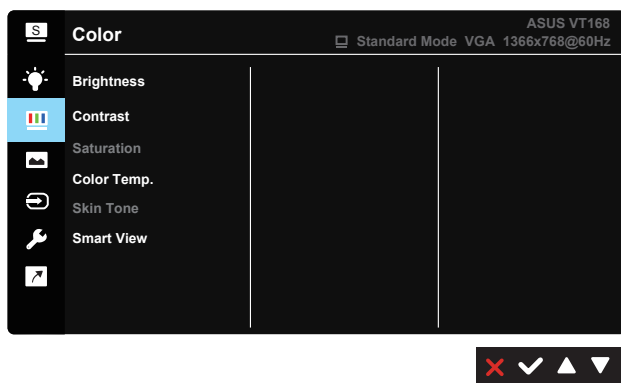
- **Level 0:** No change.
- **Level 1~4:** The higher the level, the more blue light will be reduced.



When Blue Light Filter is activated, the default settings of Standard Mode will be automatically imported. Between Level 1 to Level 3, the Brightness function is user-configurable. Level 4 is optimized setting. It is compliance with TUV Low Blue Light Certification. The Brightness function is not user-configurable.

## 3. Color

Select the image color you like from this function.



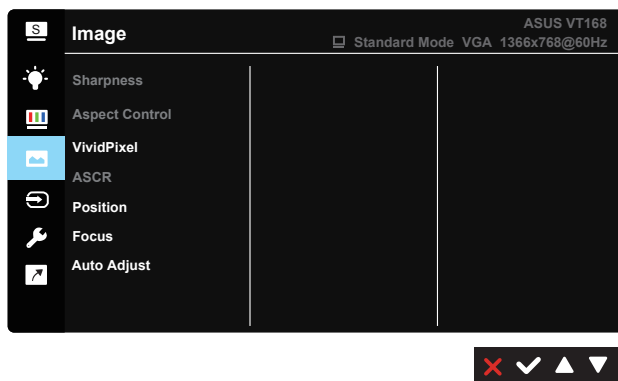
- **Brightness:** The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Contrast:** The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Saturation:** The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Color Temp.:** Contain three preset color modes (Cool, Normal, Warm) and one User Mode.
- **Skin Tone:** Contain three color modes including Reddish, Natural, and Yellowish.
- **Smart View:** The versatile viewing positions with Smart View Technology.



In the **User Mode**, colors of **R (Red)**, **G (Green)**, and **B (Blue)** are userconfigurable; the adjusting range is from 0 ~ 100.

#### 4. Image

You can adjust the image Sharpness, Aspect Control, VividPixel, ASCR, Position, Focus and Auto Adjust from this main function.



- **Sharpness:** Adjust the picture sharpness. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100. (Only disable for selecting “Standard Mode” and “sRGB Mode” in Splendid menu.)
- **Aspect Control:** Adjust the aspect ratio to “Full”, “1366 x 768”, “1360 x 768”, “4:3”. (When input timing is 1366 x 768@60 or 1360 x 768@60.)
- **VividPixel:** ASUS Exclusive Technology that brings lifelike visuals for crystal-clear and detail-oriented enjoyment. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **ASCR:** Select ON or OFF to enable or disable dynamic contrast ratio function. (ASCR: ASUS Smart Contrast Ratio. Disabled at “Standard Mode”, “sRGB Mode” and “Reading Mode.”)

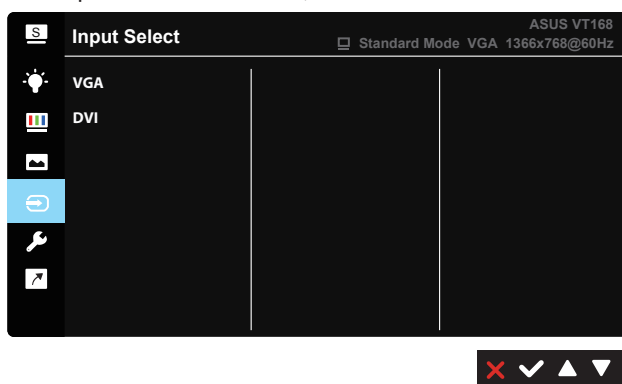
- **Position:** Adjust the horizontal position (H-Position) and the vertical position (V-Position) of the image. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100. (Only available for VGA input.)
- **Focus:** Reduce Horizontal-line noise and Vertical-line noise of the image by adjusting (Phase) and (Clock) separately. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100. (Only available for VGA input.)
- **Auto Adjust:** Automatically adjust the image to its optimized position, clock, and phase. (Only available for VGA input.)



4:3 is only available when input source is in 4:3 format.

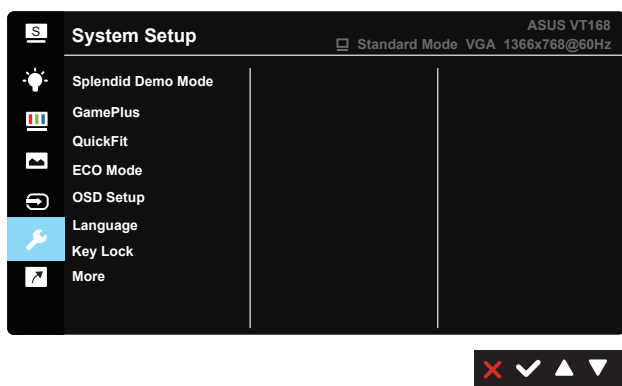

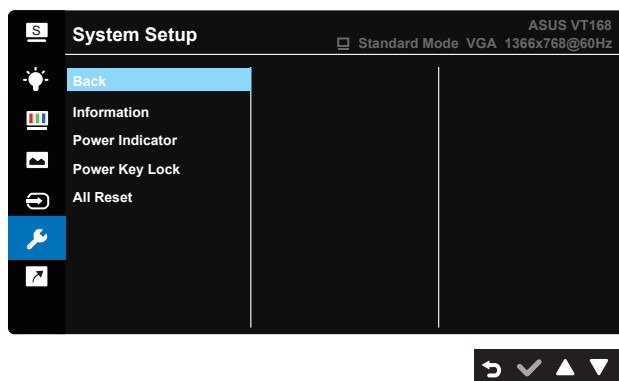
Select the input source from **VGA, DVI**.

- **Splendid Demo Mode:** Activate the demo mode for the Splendid function.
- **GamePlus:** The GamePlus Function provides a toolkit and creates a better gaming environment for users when playing different types of games. Particularly, Crosshair function is specially designed for new gamers or beginners interested in First Person Shooter (FPS) games.

To active GamePlus:

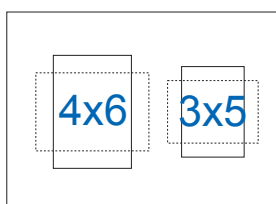
- Select **ON** to enter the GamePlus main menu.
- Press ◀ and ▶ to select between Chrosshair and Timer function.
- Press ✓ to confirm the function you choose. Press ↶ to go back. Press ✗ to go off, and exit.

- **QuickFit:** Contains two patterns: (1) Grid (2) Photo size.
1. Grid patterns: The grid patterns facilitate designers and users to organize content and layout on a page and achieve a consistent look and feel.



2. Photo size: The various real photo sizes displayed in the QuickFit function provides photographers and other users to accurately view and edit their photos in real size on the screen.

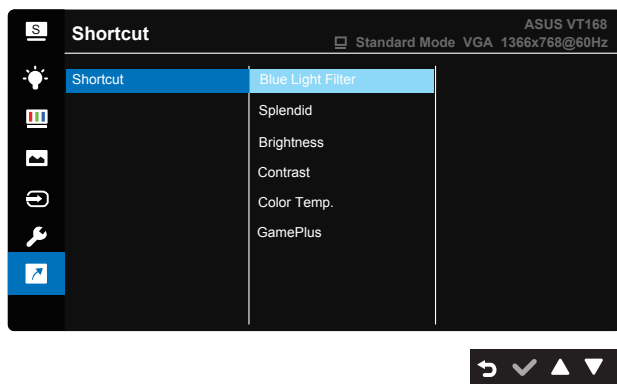


- **ECO Mode:** Activate the ecology mode for power saving.
- **OSD Setup:** Adjusts the **OSD Timeout**, **DDC/CI**, and **Transparency** of the OSD screen.
- **Language:** Select OSD language. The selections are: **English, French, German, Spanish, Italian, Dutch, Russian, Poland, Czech, Croatia, Hungary, Romania, Portugal, Turkey, Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Persian, Thai and Indonesian.**
- **Key Lock:** Disable all key functions. Pressing the second button on the right for more than five seconds to disable key lock function.
- **More:** Return the next page of System Setup.
- **Back:** Return the previous page of System Setup.
- **Information:** Displays the monitor information.
- **Power Indicator:** Turn the power LED indicator on/off.
- **Power Key Lock:** To disable / enable power key.
- **All Reset:** Selects "Yes" to revert all settings to the factory default mode.



## 7. Shortcut

Selecting this option allows you to set two shortcut keys.




- **Shortcut:** User can select from “Blue Light Filter” “Splendid”, “Brightness”, “Contrast”, “Color Temp.”, “GamePlus” and set as shortcut key.
